Ms. Hall said she was also planning a secret Valentine's Day surprise for us.


Group 3: We tried to guess what her surprise was.

Holly and Dayton:


Time for sharing hearts and sweets with friends far and near!

Group 2: Ms. Hall said, "Class, I'd like you to meet Rose. She and her family just moved here. Rose will join our class. Rose brought those mystery Valentines for us."



Group 1: We took turns going to the big box and pulling out our own set of cards. We passed our Valentine's Day cards out to our friends.

We read our cards. Some cards were pretty. Some cards were funny. Some cards came with sweet treats. We put our cards into our own mailbags.


- Group 2: Bob was the last one to get his set of cards from the big box. He noticed there was still one more set of cards left in the big box. These extra cards did not seem to belong to anyone in class.
- Group 3: Bob asked, "Ms. Hall, who brought in these cards? Everyone knows you have to sign your name on Valentine's Day cards. But these cards have no names at all. I cannot tell who sent them. I cannot tell who should get each one. This is a Valentine's Day mystery for sure."

Group 1: One day Ms. Hall showed us how to turn paper bags into Valentine's Day mailbags. She made one for us to see.

She used a white paper bag and hearts. The hearts were all different sizes and colors. She used glue to put the hearts on the bag.

Group 2: Ms. Hall used the hearts to make flower shapes! She used a green marker to add leaves and stems.

Ms. Hall turned the bag into a Valentine's Day mailbag.



Group 3: Ms. Hall gave us some white paper bags. She gave us some hearts of different shapes and colors. She gave us glue. We used glue to put our hearts on our bags. We turned our bags into Valentine's Day mailbags, too.

Group 1: Ms. Hall helped us make a Valentine's Day Word Wall. We made a chart of all the Valentine's Day words we know.

Group 2: Our list had words like: hearts, flowers, red, pink, white, card, candy, and friend.





Group 2: Each child put his or her set of Valentine's Day cards into the big box. Soon the big box was full to the top! We could not wait to pass the cards out to each other.

Group 3: The big day was here—it was time to pass out our cards. Ms. Hall told us to put our mailbags on our desks. We would use our mailbags to hold our cards.

Group 2: First, Ms. Hall helped us cover a big box with red paper. Next, we taped the paper in place. Then we used glue to put the hearts on the box.

Bob wrote this: "My Valentine's Day wish is that I have a lot of fun!"



All: Ms. Hall hung our pictures near our Valentine's Day Word Wall.

Then she wrote this on her chart:

"My Valentine's Day wish is that you each find a new friend!"
