so happy that you are here, Mom!




Brit: Just then, one more mom walked

Brit: All moms love parties. Maybe, we can have a party!


Ms. Hall: Those are all great ideas!

Frank: Hi, Mom!


Keisha: Hi, Mom!


James: Hi, Mom!
