Introducing the 100th Day Glasses & Crowns Kit

The 100th Day Glasses & Crowns Kit provides a variety of activities to make your class celebration fun.

No Peeking Memory Game

Here's a fun little game of observation you can play after giving your students their 100th Day Glasses.

1. Begin by reminding students that glasses are usually worn to help people see better.
2. Have children wear their 100th Day Glasses as they look around the room to try and remember as many things as they can about what they see.
3. Tell children you are going to let them look around the room for 100 seconds. (Count aloud as children chime in.)

4. Have children close their eyes (no peeking!).
5. With their eyes still closed, ask children to answer some questions about the room, such as:
 - What color is my desk?
 - What color are the walls of our classroom?
 - How many bulletin boards are in our classroom?
 - What are three things on the walls?
 - How many chairs are in our writing corner?(Tip: These sample questions require that children recall specific visual details of their classroom. To make the questions a bit easier, or if working with younger children, offer a choice of answers, such as: "How many chairs are in our writing corner? Four or eight?")
6. With practice, children should be able craft questions to pose to each other.

100th Day Crowning Achievement Class Book

1. As children look on, use the board or chart paper to record the 100th Day poem printed here.
2. Teach children to sing the lyrics to the tune of "Row, Row, Row Your Boat".
3. Invite children to illustrate their individual copies of the song by depicting things they learned. Or, take individual photos of children wearing their 100th Day Crowns and Glasses and use copies of these photos to illustrate students' pages. (If you wish, students can display their 100th Day collections in the photos.)
4. Help children add captions to their pages.
5. Consider adding in photos of your own from class projects and trips.
6. Take a group photo of children wearing their 100th Day Crowns and Glasses. Use the photo to illustrate the cover of a class book titled, "Our 100th Day Crowning Achievement Class Book!"
7. Bind the pages together between the cover pages. Share the book in class and allow children to take turns taking the book home to share with their families.

Crowning Glory Parade

1. Parade in and around your school wearing your 100th Day Crowns and Glasses.
2. As you parade, sing the following lyrics to the tune of "Row, Row, Row Your Boat":

We're here to celebrate
100 days of school!
We learned so very much!
Learning is so cool!

3. Take photos of your parade and use to embellish the cover and inside pages of your class book (see bookmaking directions above).
4. Include a copy of the lyrics in your class book.
