















Letter Matching Practice

Players: Up to 52

Object: To pair up with your letter match

1. Select pairs of uppercase and lowercase Letter Matching Playing Cards, shuffle the Cards, and pass them out to the players. The students should be sitting down, and should not show their Cards to others until you say "Go."
 2. When you say "Go," the students get up, display their Cards in front of them and walk around to find their uppercase or lowercase letter partner: A with a, B with b, etc. When partners find each other, they should line up by the wall. (Optional: Students line up in alphabetical order.)
 3. When everyone has lined up, have the partners hold up their Cards and say which letters they have.

Letter Matching Concentration

Players: 2 to 4

Object: To try to remember the location of Cards in order to make uppercase/lowercase letter matches.

1. Shuffle the Cards and place them face down in rows on a table or floor.
2. Player 1 takes a turn, flipping over two Cards to see if they make a letter pair. If they do, the player keeps the Cards and takes one more turn. If not, the player flips the Cards face down and the turn is over. The players try to remember the location of the Cards.
3. Player 2 takes a turn, and so on.
4. When all the pairs have been found, the player who has the greatest number of pairs wins the game.
5. Discuss any challenges before playing another round.
